Report from the Editors of *Antichthon*

The editors of *Antichthon*, Peter Davis and Elizabeth Minchin, report that volume 41, the volume for 2007, was distributed towards the end of the year, *suo anno*. Volume 41 contains six articles and a report on Greek and Latin teaching in Australasian universities. Four of the articles are contributed from colleagues at Australasian universities. Two come from overseas contributors, one of whom is Barbara Gold, who was the keynote speaker at the Hobart Conference in 2006.

The editors' task is to invite submissions for *Antichthon*, to select referees, to make final decisions on the basis of the referees' reports, and to communicate with the authors during the period that leads up to acceptance or otherwise of the submission. But the production of the actual journal is another task altogether. The careful formatting of papers, the collation of proofreading feedback from the editors and the authors, the negotiations with the printer – all these time-consuming duties have been taken on over the last three years by Bruce Marshall. We are extremely grateful to him.

ASCS members may have noticed that each of the latest three volumes has been distinguished by a novelty: volume 39 included a CD; volume 40, the special Catullus issue, featured a non-standard cover; and volume 41 introduces colour images. Bruce has dealt with all these problems with patience, good humour, and painstaking care. We could not ask for better support.
