Report on the ASCS Greek and Latin Translation Competitions 2015

The ASCS Greek and Latin Translation Competitions are each held as a class test in which students at 200 and 300 level translate an unseen piece of text in 45-50 minutes. This year overall there were 31 entries from five

universities. In 2015 there were 23 entries for the Latin Unseen, a passage from Caesar's *Bellum Civile* 1 set by Dr. Jane Bellemore of the University of Newcastle, and 8 for the Greek, a passage from Strabo's *Geography*, set by Dr. Amelia Brown of the University of Queensland. The breakdown of entries submitted from each institution is as follows:
